Elianne was there to greet us when we arrived on a cold, blustery day, pelted by hail stones. We soon found ourselves in a spaciouly pleasing reception area, full of comfortable chairs. With a very welcome cup of hot tea in hand, we were happy to be surrounded by familiar U3A faces.

From the moment our tour began, congenial members of the Carlton Players presented us with a wealth of information related to the formation of the company and the purchase and development of its present home.

Having begun my working life as a set designer, painter and bit-part player in weekly repertory theatre I was very happy to re-connect with the intricacies of a living, working venture and to be reminded of the enormity of effort, will and creativity that needs to be expended in order to keep it functioning. There were about twenty in our group and I think we were all full of admiration for the level of commitment and skill the company had brought to the project. We were impressed by the degree of organisational detail and the use of space. 
U3A Art Sessions

I am proposing to offer a time limited course (2 hours per week for 6 weeks?) on Basic Drawing which will be held in one of the rooms at the church.

As there is a charge of £10 for the room it makes sense to ensure we have approximately 10 people signed up for the course in order to keep costs to a reasonable level. I am therefore trying to find a day and time to suit as many people as possible. I am not able to do all day Monday or Wednesday afternoon but can be flexible for the rest of the week. Key points

- Experience is not necessary – the course will cover basic mark making, tone, measuring, and perspective.
- Participants will need to provide their own paper (A3 sketching pad) and pencils (2B, 3B, 4/6B pencils).
