## Wirral waters update – Richard Mawdsley



Cultural, Coastal and Heritage attractions make Wirral a great place to live but we all know of the decline of the port and the deprivation on one side of the peninsula. With Peel's investment could 250 acres of brownfield Birkenhead be transformed to become as attractive and successful as other modern dock cities? A presentation by Richard Mawdsley, Director of Development

at Wirral Waters, would explain the situation so far.

Firstly, we heard a potted history of The Peel Group's previous achievements – their portfolio is in infrastructure, property and ports. In Wirral Waters the aim is to provide a 'mixed-use, high-density, highly sustainable project that will elevate and regenerate the area to the benefit of its existing community.'

Described as quays and villages and hubs - office and industrial space would be provided alongside the award-winning modular housing, with education and training included as an essential part of the plan. Quality and sustainability were emphasized and Richard spoke with enthusiasm about the design of the surrounding areas - the streetscapes, the recycling of original materials wherever possible, and the planting of trees and shrubs to build Pocket Parks and dockside walkways.

With accompanying images displaying everything from the huge piles of planning applications to artists impressions of sites that are now becoming recognizable in reality, from huge paintings of Glenda and Paul, visits by Princess Anne and

Shipping Ministers, to first residents Arthur and Doreen. Richard packed it all in in and he could have gone on, however, our meeting was coming to an end, many of us had questions for him and a group were still gathered around even as the audience were leaving the hall. With our newly gained knowledge of Wirral Waters, I'm sure we will be giving more attention to the changes taking place around that area.

## **Art Appreciation. 'Another View' - The Lady Lever Gallery**









Due to industrial action and closures putting our plans for a visit to Walker Art Gallery into disarray, Bernadette organized a meeting at the Lady Lever Gallery. Many others must have made the same decision because the gallery was very busy.

We were here to see the new exhibition – 'Another View', which explores and celebrates the history of landscapes by women artists. It is spread across three rooms - From Amateur to Artist, Expanding Horizons and A New Path - starting with early depictions by female amateur artists and moving through the 19th and 20th centuries, with works ranging from oil paintings to prints, drawings and photographs.

British landscape art is traditionally dominated by male artists and Bernadette spoke of how the social, economic and cultural values of the times affected the opportunities women had to create art, and also the way in which their artwork was seen. She quoted Virginia Woolf, saying 'I would venture to guess that Anon.....was often a woman'. It was interesting to see the timeline of art on display aligned with the women artists' growing ambition and their development of technique as they got more of a foothold in the art world. This exhibition is on till 18<sup>th</sup> August.
